Good work-package fit

- One API integration, webhook flow, scheduled job, or data exchange
- One dashboard/reporting stream with defined source data and metrics
- One web/CMS remediation, migration slice, accessible component set, or focused portal
- One CRM dataset cleanup/import and operational reporting view
- Documentation, test evidence, deployment notes, and handoff for the package

Technical range

TypeScript, React, Next.js, REST APIs, webhooks, serverless jobs, SQL/data transformations, dashboard and analytics workflows, CMS systems, CRM operations, and cloud-connected deployment paths across existing Google Cloud, Azure, AWS, Cloudflare, or Vercel resources when the package calls for them.

- Written interface contract: inputs, outputs, dependencies, and acceptance tests

Teaming truth

Hardly Creative is a new federal vendor and does not claim prior federal contracts, an established subcontracting record, named teaming partners, or outside references. Qualification should rely on the proposed work package, builder interview, owned-system walkthroughs, code or artifact review, and a small paid milestone where procurement permits.

Best first teaming motion

Give Hardly Creative a separable, testable package that can earn an objective acceptance receipt. Avoid roles requiring staff augmentation, security clearance, regulated authorization, physical installation, or unsupported insurance/compliance attestations.
